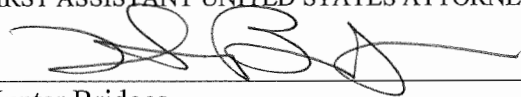
The First Assistant United States Attorney charges:

COUNT ONE

On or about April 29, 2020, in the Western District of Arkansas, Fayetteville Division, the defendant, **TIFFANY ACUFF**, did willfully and knowingly make and use a false writing and document, knowing it to contain a materially false, fictitious, and fraudulent statement and representation in a matter within the jurisdiction of the Small Business Administration (SBA), a federal agency, by submitting an application for a loan under the SBA's Paycheck Protection Program to Generations Bank in Fayetteville, Arkansas, in which she swore that she was the sole owner of a loan-eligible business, bearing Tax Identification Number (TIN) *****38, with a monthly payroll obligation of \$8,333.33, well knowing and believing that she was never an owner of any such business.

All in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1001(a)(3).
